Shelly Willis: Public Art in Sacramento Wednesday, September 21, 2016, 1:15 PM Crocker Art Museum, Setzer Auditorium

Shelly Willis, a favorite Kingsley speaker, is director of the Sacramento Metropolitan Arts Commission (SMAC), the Agency charged by the City and County of Sacramento to develop arts programs. Shelly came to SMAC in 2008 specifically to manage the Agency's Art in Public Places Program. This Program mandates that a percentage of the construction cost of any City and County project (and some privately developed ones) be set aside for artwork. Shelly has overseen more than a hundred local arts projects. Some of these projects accompany new parks and libraries. And then there is the highly acclaimed \$8 million art program at the Sacramento International Airport. You may remember her preview and talk about the airport art collection- do you love/hate the Red Rabbit?



In October, Golden One Arena, the new home of the Sacramento Kings, will open. Accompanying this world class sports facility will be world class art. Ms. Willis -- the speaker most qualified to give you background on this art program-- will illustrate her lecture with photos of many recent art installations, give a recap of August's successful International Mural Project, and then give a first look at what we will be able to see at the new Arena.

KINGSLEY ART CLUB FIELD TRIP SAN FRANCISCO MUSEUM OF MODERN ART

Thursday, September 29, 2016



Our first trip this season will be the much anticipated and long awaited visit to the newly expanded SFMOMA. There are now seven floors with 146,000 sq. ft. of viewing space, an increase of 86,000 sq. ft. over the original building. Many donations, some through the "Campaign for Art ", some through private donors, such as Doris and Donald Fisher, have increased the size of the museum collection. In addition to the permanent collection there are several special exhibits on display now, including "Paul Klee in Color", sixteen paintings and watercolors, on the second floor as well as,

"Campaign for Art: Contemporary" which reflects diversity in art since 1980 and includes New York figures such as Jeff Koons, and well-known California and international artists located on floor seven. "Art in California: Three Views", on floor two, is divided into three units: the UC Davis artists, including Robert Arneson, and Wayne Thiebaud, artists that laid a personal foundation of California art, such as Joan Brown, and Bay Area Conceptual art of the '60's and '70's. The amazing collection of 260 works donated by Doris and Donald



Fisher is divided among three floors, four to six. Another not to be missed exhibit is "Open Ended: Painting and Sculpture since 1900". As you can tell there is much to see and experience.

To allow as much time as possible to enjoy this magnificent new structure and the exhibits therein, we will spend the entire day at SFMOMA. The Museum has three restaurants: a coffee shop, Sightglass, Café 5, for light lunches, and the well-known In Situ. In Situ welcomes walk-ins but does take reservations. Lunch will be on your own.
